Did you realise...


Late arrival at school through the primary years is often related to non-attendance during secondary school.

Missing 1 day a week of school from Reception to year 10 means missing 2 years and 1 term of schooling.

Being half an hour late to school each day from Reception to Year 10 equals missing 1 year and one and a half terms of schooling.

Being absent 5 days a term from Reception to Year 10 adds up to more than one year of missed schooling.





Year 3/4 with Mrs Saunders

To start our year with a positive mindset we have been looking at the Dr Suess book "Oh, the Places You'll Go".

After reading the book together we broke into small groups to analyse the meanings of some of the passages in the book. As you can see, we did some really amazing thinking which led to a meaningful class discussion.

Sometimes you won't win and that's OK.

You can choose to do anything with your life.

If you fall down, pick yourself up.

One of the book's main messages is that if you keep persisting you can do anything you want in your life. We are using this message as a prompt for our descriptive writing, imagining ourselves as happy adults and writing about our bright futures.

If something goes wrong don't worry, don't panic.

Never give up.

Just keep trying.

You can do this.


You will be able to handle whatever set back comes your way.

In Art we are using the metaphor of the hot air balloon as the mechanism for steering your life in the direction you choose as inspiration.

We are learning the techniques needed for Papier Mache to create 3D mini hot air balloons that we will then decorate and hang in our classroom as a reminder that we can do hard things if we keep trying.

COVID-19 Update - QR Codes

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

Parking Around Schools

Due to the chaotic nature of traffic around schools at peak times, streets can be an extremely dangerous place for children.

Young children have not yet fully developed their cognitive abilities and therefore their perception, judgement and awareness of potentially dangerous situations is not adequately developed to enable them to cope with the road

Children are not easily visible and often act impulsively, which means if you are driving around a school take special care, to ensure we keep our children safe. Remember that children copy grown-ups - encourage good road sense by watching them closely and leading by example.

5 Helpful Tips for School Zones

As parents and caregivers we have a great responsibility to ensure children stay safe in school zones. We also play a key role in educating children about road safety. Here are 5 helpful tips for safety in school zones:

- Allow enough time to take your child to the school gate safely and without rushing.
- Always observe parking signs and speed limits in and around school zones. They are designed to keep your child safe.
- Talk about signs and traffic lights with your child. Identify and discuss places where it is safe to get out of the car and cross the road.
- Teach your child how to cross the road using the 'stop, look and listen' process stop at the kerb, look and listen for traffic and then decide whether it is safe to cross.
- Park a few streets away and walk your child to school. This is also good exercise and helps teach your child road safety rules

Behaviours to Avoid

- Speeding
- Double parking
- Parking too close to an intersection
- Parking across driveways
- Parking too close to pedestrian crossings
