

A big thank you to all staff who made this a memorable experience. See inside for photos.
















Mrs Aleysha - Year 1

Our class has been exploring patterns during their maths lessons.


ALGEBRA: In this unit, students will identify repeated patterns and be able to describe the pattern structure. Students will use this knowledge to copy, continue and create their own patterns. Students will learn about sequencing and be able to make predictions about what comes next in a sequence. Students will learn to use numbers to describe patterns, create number sentences and use skip counting to identify missing elements and predict what comes next in a pattern sequence.






'I can' statements:

Skoolbag is now Audiri

The Skoolbag app we use for communication to our families has now changed its name to Audiri. The name change will not change the way the app is used or your log on details.

To upgrade to Audiri, all you need to do is go to the App or Play Store and update your Skoolbag app.

If you previously did not have the Skoolbag app we recommend you now download Audiri onto your iOS or Android device. Audiri is the easiest way to stay up to date with school notices and newsletters. Notifications are sent once new content is added. You can also submit change of details and student absentee forms via Audiri.

Did you realise...

- Late arrival at school through the primary years is often related to non-attendance during secondary
- Missing 1 day a week of school from Reception to year 10 means missing 2 years and 1 term of schooling.
- Being half an hour late to school each day from Reception to Year 10 equals missing 1 year and one and a half terms of schooling.
- Being absent 5 days a term from Reception to Year 10 adds up to more than one year of missed schooling.
