Parent Engagement

Thank you to parents for your ongoing engagement in your child's learning. Research has shown that when parents are engaged in their children's learning and build strong connections with their children's school, there can be significant benefits for children:

- They are more likely to enjoy learning and be motivated to do well
- They have stronger relationships with other children
- They have greater confidence and social skills
- They do better at school and have increased wellbeing
- They are less likely to miss days at school

What do we mean when we say parent engagement?

Parent engagement in children's learning is about working closely with your child's teachers to help your child to succeed. Parent engagement means knowing what they are learning at school, finding ways to bring school learning into the home, and helping teachers to know and understand your child so that they can help your child to thrive at school. Strong partnerships between schools, parents and families are essential for children to be successful in their learning.

Every parent can be engaged in their child's learning

Being engaged in your child's learning doesn't have to cost a lot of money or take a lot of time. The way that you engage in your child's learning will change as they grow older, but there are three key factors that will help your child to be successful in their learning regardless of their age.

- Let them know you value learning. You can let your child know that you value education by showing an interest in what they are learning at school. Ask about lessons and how their teacher is teaching them. Talk positively about their school, their teachers and about your own experiences of education.
- Show them the ways you continue to learn, even as an adult. Let them see you read, and make sure they have comfy places to read. School and public libraries are great resources, and have books that cater to every child's interests.
- Discuss their hopes for the future. Set high expectations for your child's learning and show them you believe in them.

We look forward to working with you and sharing in your child's learning journey for the remainder of the year.

Students in Karra Unit will share their 'buddy books', with families of students in Karra unit invited to visit after the parade.








Adventure to Thrive

Dental for Schools will be at Keller Road Primary School:

5th - 8th of September 2023

Please fill in a form to have your child seen by a dental clinician at school.

The visit is ${\it FREE}$ for families eligible for Medicare's Child Dental Benefit Scheme & will include:

- Check-up (oral examination)
- Clean (removal of plaque/calculus)
- · Application of fluoride (remineralisation agent)
- X-rays (diagnostic bitewings)

If your child requires any further treatment (fillings, crowns, extractions etc.) we will contact you to discuss a treatment plan that we may be able to complete at school. You will also receive a dental report that will be provided in your child's take home pack.

If you are not eligible for Medicare (or not sure of eligibility), please fill in the form and our team will contact you.
