**Promoting Emotional Literacy:** Encouraging students to express and manage their emotions effectively.

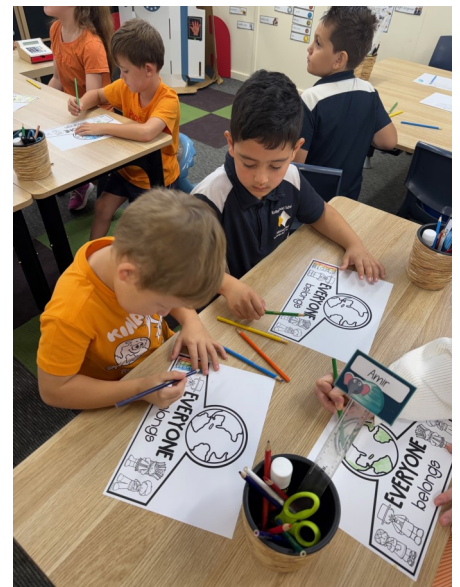
**Adapting Teaching Strategies:** Using flexible and inclusive teaching methods to accommodate diverse needs.

By integrating these principles, educators can better support all students, especially those who have experienced trauma, enhancing their educational outcomes and overall well-being.

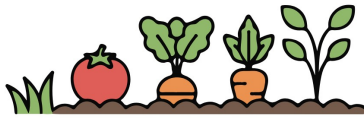
### Harmony Week
